VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITIES

YARD ASSISTANT

This role includes mucking out stables, catching and turning out horses, grooming, tacking up and untacking the horses plus many more jobs:

Volunteering in this area is best done on a half or full day basis. This then allows us to plan more effectively.

Times are as follows

7 days a week:	8:30 – 11:45
	12:30 – 4:00 half days
	8:30 - 4:00 full day

RIDING SESSION VOLUNTEERS

Most of the centre's riders are unable to ride by themselves and sometimes 3 volunteers are needed for each horse/pony – one to lead the horse and one on either side of the rider for support and safety.

A session usually lasts 45 mins and volunteers are required to assist with a variety of tasks, including leading/sidewalking and assisting riders to mount and dismounting.

Riding sessions volunteers can volunteer for as many, or as few sessions as they like.

Washington Riding Centre is a registered charity, and therefore receives no government funding, relying on donations, grants and fundraising.
